MALDON DISTRICT COMMUNITY SAFETY PARTNERSHIP Anti-Social Behaviour Minimum Standards

As part of our continued commitment to address anti-social behaviour and the perception that anti-social behaviour is a problem in the District of Maldon, in partnership we will:

1. Work to ensure reporting anti-social behaviour is as easy as possible. Take reports seriously.
2. Provide practical support in partnership with victim support agencies to address victim's needs.
3. Share relevant information and intelligence on anti-social behaviour with partner agencies.
4. Provide suitable routes via which communities or individuals can raise concerns where it is considered anti-social.

Enough is enough...

NHS RECOMMENDS

- Men should not regularly* drink more than 3-4 units a day or 21 per week.
- Women should not regularly* drink more than 2-3 units a day or 14 per week.
- * 'Regularly' means drinking these amounts every day or most days of the week

Watch Groups In Maldon

There are many watch groups already up and running in the Maldon district. They don't replace or take over from any existing organisations but provide a more coordinated approach and help to improve the flow and exchange of information between groups, such as Neighbourhood Watch, and Essex Police.

Watches currently in operation are:

- Neighbourhood Watch
- Farm Watch
- Church Watch
- Business Watch
- Marine Watch

Although they focus on different types of crime, the overall aims of all the watches are the same - getting together with your neighbours, colleagues or friends to take action can reduce local crime. Watch schemes are not police or council led, it is up to members to take ownership of them. But to work effectively, cooperation between the groups is essential.

Police can provide up-to-date crime figures and expert advice, while watch members and the council can contribute valuable local knowledge about areas within the district. Communication is vital. Crime updates and alerts are mainly sent via email through the watch coordinator based at Maldon District Council but alternative

arrangements can be made for those who do not have access to the internet. For more information about any of the watches or to join or start a scheme in your area, call 01621 875794.

*** If you have any information about a crime or suspicious activity in your area but you are wary of contacting the police, you can always call Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.**

Callers don't have to give their name or any personal information and calls cannot be traced. This means you won't need to appear in court or give a statement to the police.

LOCK THEM OUT

Burglary
Most burglaries are committed by opportunist thieves who will target homes where it is easy to gain access. Unlocked doors, windows and side gates make it easy for a burglar to strike quickly. Take a few simple precautions to protect your home.

Keep your home secure LOCK IT UP!

Bogus callers
Most people who call at your home will be there for a genuine reason but by taking a few simple precautions you can protect yourself and your home.

Follow our safety advice:

- Don't be frightened to ask for identification and always check it carefully. If you're not sure ask them to come back another day when you can have someone else with you. If the caller is who they say they are they will be happy to prove their identity.
- Install a door chain and keep it on when answering the door, only remove it when you are happy that they are who they say they are.
- If you need your glasses to see their identification, close the door before going to find them. Don't leave the door open and unattended.
- Remember to lock the back door before opening the front door.
- Don't be pressured into letting someone into your home if you have suspicions.
- Don't keep large amounts of cash in the house.
