### 7.2.1 2 additional letters have been received objecting to the application.

Objecting Comment	Officer Response
Concerns over the loss of light to the neighbouring gardens and dwellings.	Comments noted. See Section 5.3.
Concerns over the additional side windows resulting in a loss of privacy to the neighbouring site to the east.	See Section 5.3.2. The additional ground floor windows are not considered to cause a loss of privacy due to their location at ground floor level. The first floor window will be located 1.7 metres above the floor level which is not considered to cause an unacceptable loss of privacy.
