Purpose and Protocol / working practices for the Overview and Scrutiny committee

From November 2020, the Overview and Scrutiny Committee sits as 10 members, who are not serving on either the Performance, Governance and Audit or Strategy and Resources Committees.

The committee Terms of Reference can be found at:

The Working Group established and reporting to this committee will include Four members and:

- Review items of scrutiny suggested by members according to specific criteria and outcomes.
- Identify the details of scrutiny items e.g. specific outcomes, timescales and lead officers.
- Recommend a workplan for approval of the Committee.

The committee:

Will -

- Seek to confine its meetings to the carrying out of actual scrutiny work.
- Arrange for the review of Member suggestions for items and review validity of items based on set criteria, prior to inclusion in its Workplan.
- Be positive and forward looking including providing 'critical friend' challenge.
- Identify future improvements that will help the way the Council runs its business and provides public services.
- Seek to demonstrate added value from the scrutiny process.
- Review readiness for emerging strategy and future planning.
- Help Council and other Committees do their work better.
- Produce defined outcomes associated with each scrutiny item.
- Manage 'watching brief' items for areas of concern where the need for or the precise area of scrutiny has not been identified - to be picked up by the Working Group (e.g. lessons learned from Project Management Office).
- Refer potential scrutiny items to the working group for thorough review, and receive reports on items to be added to the workplan.
- Receive finalised Scrutiny reports and recommendations for review.
- Make recommendations to Council and other Committees on conclusions arising from scrutiny.

Won't -

- Develop a workplan based on 'pet projects' of individual Members or matters that should be properly dealt with elsewhere, e.g. via another Committee's remit.
- Duplicate review work being undertaken elsewhere, e.g. by another Committee.
- Look backwards or be focussed on blame, rather than come from a place of 'lessons learned'.
- Use Committee Meetings as a forum for receiving information, discussing/ planning the detail and validity of suggested scrutiny items.
- Accept items where Officers have not yet been approached and asked for response/ further detail on a matter.
- Accept items where they fall in the remit of another committee, and that committee hasn't made the referral, or first reviewed it within their Committee.
- Have a standing item for 'any other items of scrutiny members wish to consider' as under the proposed new process is designed to accommodate this.

Terms of Reference Working group of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee

The working group will be made up of four Overview and Scrutiny committee members, and meet in the daytime in advance of the Committee meetings to consider, review and recommend to the Committee on:

- 1. Review new scrutiny item requests in accordance with the process and criteria established by the Committee and report to the Committee on valid and identifiable scrutiny items for inclusion in the Committee's Workplan.
- 2. Keep under review any other matters where the Committee has identified a need to seek information or to maintain a 'watching brief' pending the identification of a scrutiny item.
- 3. Support the Committee as directed in the planning of scrutiny work, including proposing timetables and expected Scrutiny Outcomes.

The Working Group meetings will include relevant officers where more detailed discussion can help inform these decisions.

APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERSHIP OF COMMITTEES OF THE COUNCIL

1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1 To appoint serving Members for Committees for the remainder of the Municipal year (to May 2021).

2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- (i) That the allocation of seats on Committees as set out in section 3.6 below, be ratified;
- (ii) That the Member nominations set out in **APPENDIX A**, be approved;
- (iii) That where nominations haven't been received, to appoint Members to these Committee positions.

3. SUMMARY OF KEY ISSUES

- 3.1 Under Section 15 (1) (b) of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989, the Council is required at its Annual Meeting to review the representation of different political groups on committees of the authority.
- 3.2 In carrying out such a review and in making appointments to committees following that review, the Council is under a duty only to make such appointments as give effect to the principles contained in Section 15(5) of the above Act. In essence, this requires local authorities to review committee membership and political representation annually. By law, seats on committees must be allocated in proportion to the political composition of the Council. In addition, the total number of seats across all of the committees must reflect the overall political balance of the Council.
- 3.3 Notification has been made to me of three political groups constituted for the purposes of the political balance provisions namely:

Independent	15 Members
Conservative	10 Members
Democratic Alliance	4 Members

3.4 There is a further one non-aligned member of the Council, and one vacant post.

- 3.5 Neither Political Group has a majority of the Members of the Council (51% or more) so that it would have a right to request a majority on every Committee.
- 3.6 The Council is asked to ratify the allocation of seats on Committees in the following manner:

- 3.7 As agreed by the Council on 6 August 2020 (Minute No. 1128 refers), Members of the Performance, Governance & Audit and Strategy & Resources Committees are unable to serve on the Overview and Scrutiny Committee.
- 3.8 In rounding the proportion of members to seat allocations, ten seat Committees all have a 'third' of a member for the following:
 - Conservative Group;
 - Democratic Alliance Group;
 - Non-Aligned.
- 3.8.1 These Committees therefore have a Member listed as an appointment of the Council, that will need to come from one of the two groups listed or a non-aligned Member.

3.9 **Joint Standards Committee**

3.9.1 Two Conservative Independent Parish Councillors sit on the Committee (to be elected following receipt of nominations from the Essex Association of Local Councils).

3.10 **Investigating and Disciplinary Panel**

3.10.1 In addition to the Committees of the Council referred to in Procedure Rule 17, the Council is required to establish an Investigating and Disciplinary Panel (see Procedure Rule 16(11)(a)) to which Members are appointed and the political balance provisions apply. This is distinct from the Investigating and Disciplinary Committee in terms of both purpose and membership and has therefore been included in the list. The Terms of Reference for this Panel provide for a minimum of five Members of which three shall be Councillors who have not served on the initial investigation carried out by the Investigating and Disciplinary Committee and two or three Independent Persons appointed by the Council to assist the Joint Standards Committee under the Localism Act 2011.

3.10.2 The report seeks to appoint a pool of ten members that can be called upon for meetings.

3.11 **Appointments Committee**

- 3.11.1 The Council is also required to appoint Members to serve on the Appointments Committee. The Council and Committee Procedure Rule 17(8) provides for the constitution of this Committee, to be made up of:
 - Leader of the Council (or Deputy),
 - Opposition Leader (or Deputy),
 - Chairmen (or Vice-Chairmen) of the Strategy & Resources and the Performance, Governance & Audit Committees,
 - Plus two other named Members appointed by the Council (political balance provisions shall apply).

3.12 **Area Planning Committees**

3.12.1 In accordance with the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups)
Regulations 1990 Part IV, Paragraph 16(a), the membership of the Area Committees is confirmed in the attached **APPENDIX A**.

4. CONCLUSION

4.1 The Committee seat allocation and member nominations are provided for member review, and nominations sought for the non-aligned and Council appointment positions.

AGENDA ITEM NO.21: COVID-19 ECONOMIC RECOVERY - CAR PARKING

1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

- 1.1 Since drafting the report to the Council regarding support to local businesses through the provision of free car parking times, the Government has announced a new National Lockdown which commenced today, 5 November and will run to 2 December 2020.
- 1.2 Specific days were identified during November and December to apply free parking periods and these can be found at section 3.1.2 of the main report. Clearly the National Lockdown and closure of the hospitality sector and non-essential retail activity may impact upon the benefit of free parking to local business.
- 1.3 To reflect the above it is suggested the Director of Service Delivery be given the flexibility to change the six dates <u>if</u> necessary. Any changes would be in consultation with local business to ensure maximum benefit is achieved. The flexibility could also include a run into 2021 if necessary. The most important point is we provide free parking when it is needed.
- 1.4 Members are asked to approve the existing report recommendations noting the request to allow flexibility in dates as suggested. The Christmas Eve option (recommendation (ii)) is still valid as is the consultation on evening charges.
