### 310. CHAIRMAN'S NOTICES

The Chairman welcomed everyone to this remote meeting of the Strategy and Resources Committee, held under new regulations which had come into effect in response to the COVID-19 situation. The Chairman then went through some general housekeeping arrangements for the meeting.

A roll call of those Members present was taken.

The Chairman welcomed Chief Inspector Scott-Haynes and Inspector Thurston to the meeting.

### 311. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

An apology for absence was received from Councillor R P F Dewick.

### 312. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

**RESOLVED** (by assent) that the Minutes of the meeting of the Committee held on 22 October 2020 be agreed.

### 313. DISCLOSURE OF INTEREST

There were none.

### 314. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

There was none.

Councillor Miss A M Beale joined the meeting at this point.

### 315. MALDON DISTRICT COMMUNITY SAFETY PARTNERSHIP UPDATE

The Committee received the report of the Director of Service Delivery reporting the progress of activities undertaken by the Maldon Community Safety Partnership (CSP) since the last meeting of the Committee on 22 October 2020. The report highlighted the proposed strategic priorities for 2020 / 21.

The most recent Essex Police performance summary (to 31 January 2021) was attached as Appendix 1 to the report.

Members noted the continued good work of the CSP and the liaison it had with Essex Police and other statutory partners. The current Maldon CSP action plan was attached as Appendix 2.

The Community Safety Partnership Manager gave a presentation to Members which highlighted the report and outlined the CSP's:

- statutory duties;
- five priorities for 2020 / 21 and 2021 / 22;
- structure, including the impact of COVID-19;
- events and projects.

During his presentation the Community Safety Partnership Manager also highlighted:

- the impact of COVID-19 on a number of areas
- the new Domestic Abuse Bill 2020
- the Public Spaces Protection Order consultation being undertaken.
- how Year Six training had moved to virtual training and was proving very popular.
- that the CSP had agreed to fund a new TruCAM (speed enforcement camera).

Community Safety Partnership Manager informed Members that Les Davis had recently been appointed as Dengie Tri-Service Rural Community Officer. A short video was shown introducing the Officer and outlining the role of this collaborative post between Essex Fire Service, Essex Police and the East of England Ambulance Service. Due to some sound issues, Members were advised that a copy of the video would be placed on the Council's website for viewing outside of the meeting.

At this point, the Community Safety Partnership Manager handed over to Chief Inspector (CI) Scott-Haynes who reported that he had just been appointed as District Commander and then gave a detailed presentation, setting out the structure of the local policing teams in the District and the Force plan for 2020 / 21. He took Members through the Maldon Performance Summary and in addition highlighted the following areas:

• The impact of Covid on policing – Members' were advised of the huge demand seen to patrolling areas, the impact of the pandemic on crime and the work being undertaken to support vaccine sites and victims of domestic abuse.

The CI highlighted how the need to react quickly to changing legislation and keep Officers up to date had been difficult.

- **Recruitment** and how the 'We Value Difference' campaign was part of the successful Fit the bill recruitment drive. Members were informed of the makeup of the Town Team and the other increases to Officer numbers.
- Policing Tactics including improved accessibility, working across rural areas
  and partners and the role of the Community Safety Engagement Officers. The
  use of Facebook live had seen an increase in public attendance, but there was
  further work required in respect of Neighbourhood Watch in the Maldon
  District.
- Maldon Police Operations CI Scott-Haynes outlined a number of Police operations including how they were committed to joint tasking and problem solving. Having a Community Policing Team based at Maldon was something the CI was very keen to implement, and the Police were working with Officers at the Council to facilitate this.

The Chairman moved the recommendations set out the report which were duly seconded. Opportunity was then given to Members to ask questions of the Community Safety Partnership Manager and CI Scott-Haynes.

The Community Safety Partnership Manager and CI Scott-Haynes responded to a number of questions raised by Members and the following information was provided:

- Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) consultation The Lead Specialist:
  Community explained that the PSPO would set conditions or rules for a given area. The consultation currently being undertaken allowed anyone to comment on the PSPO and he asked Members to encourage local residents to complete the consultation. Following the consultation period a review of all comments received would be undertaken and changes considered to the PSPO, as appropriate. One in place the PSPO would last for a period of up to three years. It was noted that most large towns had a PSPO and it was an additional tool to assist with the control of Anti-Social Behaviour. In response to a question regarding the use of private security companies for collections Members were advised that any Fixed Penalty Notices would be carried out by the Police or the Community Enforcement Officers.
- Scams Members were advised that a training event for Neighbourhood Watch members was being planned. It was noted that due to the number of scams relating to the COVID vaccine Essex Police had a new unit which was dealing with this directly. The Community Safety Partnership Manager explained how if local coordinators could be upskilled in this area information could then be cascaded down.
- Counter extremism The Community Safety Partnership Manager provided an explanation and examples of some of the groups that counter extremism covered. He highlighted the importance to review these both nationally and locally and counter narrative related to it.
- Court backlogs and impact CI Scott Haynes advised that the Police had not seen any direct impact as cases were going forward and the Police were still completing files which then go forward to the Crime Prosecution Service. However it was taking longer for cases to get into court.

- CCTV pedestrian and traffic counts Members were informed that the
  Government issued particular times and dates when such counts should be
  carried out. Community Safety Partnership Manager advised that data could be
  shared with Members and highlighted other areas where the CCTV had been
  used.
- **COVID impact** CI Scott-Haynes outlined some of the issues that the Police had seen as a result of the COVID pandemic and reported on the work of his Officers during this time. It was noted that reduction to dwelling burglaries could be directly related to people being a home due to the pandemic.

At this point, the Chairman offered to CI Scott-Haynes his condolences following the recent loss of a Marine Police Officer due to COVID.

- **Emergency phone at the Council Offices** It was noted that was now installed and CI Scott-Haynes reported that it had been used a number of times.
- Addressing Police visibility and public perception The CI outlined a number of measures being implemented which included an increased social media presence, monthly newsletter from the CI, getting the Community policing teams out on the ground. In response to a question regarding the reporting of Crime, CI Scott-Haynes advised that where there was potential for a witness, CCTV, named suspect or description of suspect a Police officer would attend but drew attention to demand on services.
- Solved rates Members were advised that these rates went up and down, however the Police were looking to use different outcomes as not all outcomes were recorded a solved crime (the CI gave some examples of this). CI Scott-Haynes reported that the Maldon District had the highest solved rates for the whole of Essex and he attributed this to the willingness of the community to report crime.

The Chairman thanked CI Scott-Haynes, Inspector Thurston, the Community Safety Partnership Manager and Lead Specialist: Community for their input. He moved the recommendations set out the report which were duly agreed by assent.

**RESOLVED** (by assent) that the current progress of the initiatives undertaken by the partnership to date and the strategic priorities for 2021 / 22 be noted.

### 316. POLICE PERFORMANCE UPDATE

The Police Performance Update was given as part of the Maldon District Community Safety Partnership Update.

#### MALDON DISTRICT COMMUNITY SAFETY PARTNERSHIP UPDATE

#### 1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1 Members are asked to note the progress of activities undertaken by the Maldon Community Safety Partnership (CSP) since the last meeting held on 11 March 2021.

### 2. RECOMMENDATION

That Members review and comment on the current progress of the initiatives undertaken by the partnership to date.

#### 3. SUMMARY OF KEY ISSUES

### 3.1 **Statutory Duties**

- 3.1.1 The strategic assessment was presented at the meeting of the Responsible Authorities Group (RAG) on 4 March 2021 and the priorities for 2021 / 22 remained the same as the previous year following a countywide decision to endorse this due to the impact of the pandemic. The priorities, listed below, reflect priorities already identified in the current Police and Crime Plan, the Essex Police Crime Prevention Strategy and the current Essex Police Strategic Assessment. It should be noted that Essex Police will launch a new Crime Prevention Strategy 2021-2025 on 29 November 2021 which has been to Safer Essex as part of the consultation process. The new Police and Crime Plan should also be approved by this meeting following a period of public consultation.
- 3.1.2 The current priorities are highlighted on the Maldon District Council (MDC) website. It should be noted that reducing reoffending remains a statutory function for all community safety partnerships and is embedded in the priorities listed below.
  - Tackling crime and reducing reoffending (with an emphasis on violent crime, gangs and drug trafficking);
  - Driving down anti-social behaviour in public places (with an emphasis on youth nuisance and improving partnership visibility);
  - Identifying and supporting vulnerable people (with an emphasis on domestic abuse, social isolation, suicide prevention, mental health and hate crime);
  - Increase confidence in identifying and reducing rural crime;
  - Promoting road safety and challenging irresponsible driving.

- 3.1.3 These priorities will contribute to the Council's Corporate Plan 2021-23 for the Community, with the goal being "Through our projects, actions, communication, partnerships and policies we will work to support our communities, the health and well-being of our residents, and to provide safe and clean places to live in and enjoy." Projects are highlighted as activities in the community safety action plan for 2021 / 22. Each activity has a clear timescale with a Red, Amber, Green rating, proposed financial spend and milestone to enable performance monitoring of each project associated to the activity as per recommendations of the recent internal audit from 2020. Activities are reported quarterly to the RAG, through a finance report and monthly through the community safety partnership hub tasking meetings.
- The current Essex Police Maldon performance figures for the rolling year to 30 September 2021 (compared to the same period last year) showed a decrease in all crime by 1.7% (63 less offences) and an increase in anti-social behaviour by 19.3% (190 more incidents). It should be noted that there has been a decrease in all crime in Essex by 3.3% with an increase in anti-social behaviour by 5.1%. A summary of the crime profile for Maldon will be presented at the meeting by Sergeant Matt Dalby. The new Chief Superintendent for the North Local Policing Area: Tom Simons had an introductory meeting with the Community Safety Manager and will visit the Civic Offices on 15 October 2021. A copy of the Essex Police force performance summary for the county is attached as APPENDIX 1. Some more local contexts of the issues surrounding these crime increases will be given at the meeting. There has been an increase in anti-social behaviour (ASB) reports to the police and local authority during and post lockdown, which is a combination of nuisance behaviour, noise, fly tipping, neighbour disputes, and reports of breaches around social distancing. The Council's community engagement officers have been doing joint patrols with Essex Police during these busy periods.
- Officers continue to work with the Prevent Team and local Counter Terrorism 3.1.5 Security Advisors (CTSA) to ensure that local risks are addressed. The Community Safety Manager attends the Essex County Prevent Group on a regular basis and has recently taken over as Chairperson. The most recent Counter Terrorism Local Profile (CTLP) briefing was on 8 September 2021 and strategic members have been briefed on current risks. The terrorist alert remains at SUBSTANTIAL (an attack is a strong possibility) following the decision to reduce from SEVERE in February 2021. However, recent national changes such as the situation in Afghanistan may impact on the current threat level. Officers have met to discuss the current Protect Duty being proposed and a response was made on behalf of the partnership by the closing date for the consultation on 2 July 2021. Officers continue to engage with communities through the Independent Advisory Group which meets every two months. The last meeting was held on 26 July 2021. This acts as a good forum to discuss community tensions, hate crime and policing interventions such as Stop and Search, and gives a voice to underrepresented communities. The Community Safety Manager is also a member of the Special Interest Group in Countering Extremism (SIGCE).
- 3.1.6 MDC commenced a consultation on 24 May 2021 for a new Public Space Protection Order (PSPO). The PSPO will give the police and accredited officers more powers to tackle the use of alcohol, illegal drugs, and psychoactive substances in certain areas of the district: Maldon Promenade Park, Hythe Quay and High Street, Burnham-on-Crouch Riverside Park and High Street (and connecting roads). The consultation period ended on 4 July 2021 and Damien Ghela (Lead Specialist: Community) to provide a written update for the meeting.

### 3.2 Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner Update

- 3.2.1 Roger Hirst was re-elected as the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner (PFCC) following an election on 6 May 2021. The partnership continues to support the priorities identified in the Police and Crime Plan which was extended for a further year following the decision to delay the PFCC election for one year in 2020 because of the pandemic. A new plan will be prepared following a consultation period to run alongside the new term of the commissioner. This plan is likely to be published before the Overview and Scrutiny Committee (meeting as the Crime and Disorder Committee) meeting; 28 October 2021. Officers have met to discuss a response on the Home Office consultation in relation to giving a general power of competence (as afforded to local authorities) to all Police and Crime Commissioners (PCCs) (including PFCC). A response will be submitted to the Home Office before the consultation deadline on 27 October 2021.
- 3.2.2 Works continue with several multi-agency groups that support this work locally and across Essex. The Office of the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner (OPFCC) has confirmed that core funding for Maldon in 2021/22 will be £12,527 and the necessary funding forms were completed and returned as part of the funding agreement. The Community Safety Development Fund (CSDF) will continue throughout 2021/22 for partnerships, charities, and community groups to access funds which support the priorities of the Police and Crime Plan. The Police, Fire and Crime Panel (PFCP) approved a further increase in the council tax precept for 2021/22 (4.98% or £9.90 per annum for a Band D property) for policing which will see recruitment of another 184 extra officers in 2021 / 22. There will be no increase in the precept for fire services. The Maldon representative for the PFCP is Councillor Mark S Heard who is also the MDC representative for this meeting as agreed at the annual meeting of MDC on 20 May 2021, with Cllr Bruce B Heubner acting as substitute.
- 3.2.3 More locally the increase in policing numbers saw the introduction of Town Centre Teams for Maldon, Chelmsford and South Woodham Ferrers, the introduction of Community Safety Engagement Officers and the reintroduction of the Marine Unit (based at Burnham-on-Crouch), new Disruptor Teams established, a new Business Crime Team and the Rural Engagement Team (RET) has also doubled in size, which supports the priority of tackling rural crime and is now working very closely with the Council's community engagement officers. There has been the introduction of a triservice pilot to cover the Dengie which is an officer role funded by Essex Police, Essex County Fire and Rescue Service and East of England Ambulance Service. There was also the launch of the new initiative to patrol the coastline and waterways of Essex on 12 July 2021 that has included the joint purchase of jet skis for officer use. This initiative is receiving good support on social media platforms where prompt enforcement action has been taken.
- 3.2.4 As previously reported, the Essex Violence and Vulnerability Unit (VVU) was established with members seconded from Essex Police, County Council, Youth Offending Teams (YOT) and Probation and has seen significant Home Office funding come to Essex in 2018/19, 2019/20 and 2020/21. The VVU is hosted by Chelmsford City Council in the community safety partnership hub shared with Maldon CSP officers. The Community Safety Manager attends the Violence and Vulnerability Operations Board which reports to a Strategic Board (Roundtable). Officers are involved in the various workstreams of this strategic group: Few Causing Most Harm and Voice of Communities. A copy of the VVU Annual Report can be accessed using this link: <a href="Annual report 2020/21 Essex Violence and Vulnerability Unit (essexvvu.co.uk)">Annual report 2020/21 Essex Violence and Vulnerability Unit (essexvvu.co.uk)</a> The Home Office has also confirmed that the unit will receive £1.16 million for 2021/22 and Essex County Council (ECC) has recently announced a contribution of £500,000 for 2021/22. For further information on the VVU they can

### 3.3 Community Safety Partnership Hub and Progress Update

- 3.3.1 The Community Safety Partnership Hub for Chelmsford and Maldon meets bimonthly and has a tasking process which links to the priorities of the CSP. Tasking has migrated to Microsoft Teams during the pandemic with the most recent meeting being on 16 September 2021. There is an individual action plan for Maldon CSP plus a tasking update which is monitored to ensure that partner actions are completed and performance managed. A copy of the current Maldon CSP action plan is attached as **APPENDIX 2.** Subgroups of the partnership continue to meet on a regular basis and work streams for each individual group are effectively impacting on various areas of community safety. Regular attendees at tasking include council officers and CCTV staff, community policing team, ECC Youth Services and Youth Offending Services, Essex Community Rehabilitation Company, Family Solutions, Peabody, Phoenix Futures, Children's Health & Wellbeing Service, The Children's Society, Neighbourhood Watch, Open Road and Social Care with other partners supporting the process when necessary (analytical support, serious organised crime, intelligence etc.). The community safety hub is occupied by CSP officers, the Community Policing Team, the Town Centre Unit and the Essex VVU. This has already improved joint working within the respective teams, which will provide a much better service for the public in terms of performance, visibility, and reassurance.
- Officers attend the MACE 1 and MACE 2 (Missing and Child Exploitation) meetings 3.3.2 on Microsoft Teams to ensure that the needs of vulnerable children for the district are addressed and that processes are in place to tackle the criminal and sexual exploitation of young people. Members should be aware that the MACE and Behaviour and Attendance Partnership (BAP) groups were both awarded funding by the VVU to support young people who are on the cusp of exclusion or deemed high risk in terms of vulnerability. Officers continue to support registered social landlords in tackling anti-social behaviour cases which in time should upskill partners to enable them to tackle anti-social behaviour more effectively and improve data sharing and intelligence. The most recent meeting of this forum was 7 October 2021. More complex neighbour disputes are dealt with on a case-by-case basis. Officers also meet with the community mental health teams on a bi-monthly basis to discuss complex cases and support arrangements for vulnerable people. The partnership has supported Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) throughout the pandemic and has migrated members to Microsoft Teams with the last meetings being held on 28 and 30 September 2021 respectively. Officers also attend Mid-Essex Stay Safe, Mid-Essex Children's Partnership Board (MECPB), Chelmsford & Maldon Behaviour and Attendance Partnership (BAP), Maldon Youth Strategy Group, Safer Essex, Essex Community Safety Network, County Prevent Group, SIGCE, Essex CCTV User Group and the County Safeguarding Leads meeting.

New police officers, PC Chris Major (Chelmsford) and PC Rosie Smith (Maldon), are now working in the hub as Community Safety Engagement Officers which will be dedicated to improving engagement with our communities and will involve engagement on virtual platforms such as Facebook and Twitter. A copy of the Essex Police monthly newsletter circulated to elected members has received good feedback and is attached as **APPENDIX 3** for information only. There are opportunities to increase engagement in the Dengie with the pilot of a new tri-service role with a new officer funded by police, fire, and the ambulance service. This work has involved the creation of a fraud aware booklet for distribution in rural communities. An example of this joint working is the recent working with Southminster Parish Council on 7 October 2021.

- 3.3.3 Current concerns for the partnership hub focus on violence and vulnerability, and disruption of organised crime together with monitoring "hot spots" such as Maldon High Street, Promenade Park, Hythe Quay, and some of the parks across the district where young people are congregating and consuming alcohol and using nitrous oxide cannisters. The continued use of Operations Trespass, Aegis, Overwatch and Sceptre are proving successful and in recent months there have been significant arrests to disrupt both local and County Line drug networks.
- 3.3.4 The community safety team worked with partners to deliver a safety awareness event which included a cycle marking initiative on 27 July 2021. Officers from MDC, Essex Police, Essex Fire and Rescue Service (ECFRS) and Essex Watch all attended and there was some positive engagement with the public and thirty-three members of the public turned up to get their cycles security marked. A Senior Safety Silver Sunday event was organised on 4 October 2021 at Maldon Football Stadium for over 65s. The event was delivered with the Safer Chelmsford Partnership, Essex Police, ECFRS and NHS East of England Ambulance Service, and a variety of contributing partners. The event received good feedback with over eighty attendees. Maldon Youth Strategy has funded a professional drama by a professional drama company to be delivered in both secondary schools. The drama: 'Unacceptable', will focus on tackling sexism, sexual abuse, and sexual harassment against young women. Officers attended the recent Women's Safety Partnership Event on 30 September 2021. The community engagement team are involved in several initiatives across the district that impact on community safety:
  - Trucam is currently being delivered across 18 parishes at 45 different locations
  - Close working relationship with Essex Police Rural Engagement Team (RET) to tackle issues such as fly tipping and unlicensed waste carriers, a recent operation resulted in over 70 vehicles being stop checked
  - Partnership working with Essex Police in the form of joint patrols to encourage responsible dog ownership
  - Supporting the Community Safety Event and Bike Marking Initiative
  - Supporting Coffee with Cops
  - Joint patrols with ECC Youth Service
  - Intelligence sharing with secondary schools to safeguard any identified vulnerable persons
  - Engagement with youths through the Just Play football initiative

#### 4. CONCLUSION

4.1 That Members note the proposed priorities for 2021 / 22 and progress on the community safety partnership. The shared working arrangements between Maldon and Chelmsford continue to support local priorities, high level policing priorities and the priorities of the current PFCC plan and has strengthened with the co-location of the community policing team in March 2019 and additional policing resources in town centres and rural areas. Maldon CSP remains efficient and responsive to emerging issues and more importantly positions itself strongly for future funding arrangements with the Essex Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner, statutory partners, and local / national initiatives.

#### 5. IMPACT ON STRATEGIC THEMES

5.1 These priorities contribute to the Council's vision of "Through our projects, actions, communication, partnerships and policies we will work to support our communities, the health and well-being of our residents, and to provide safe and clean places to live in and enjoy."

# **Introduction**

The purpose of 'Your Local Police Update' is to keep our community across Maldon informed and up to date on policing activity. The ambition is to publish an update every month to provide an overview in the following areas:

- Community Policing Team
- Town Centre Team

- Forthcoming Engagement

The Community Policing Team encompasses the Town Centre Team. They undertake proactive and reactive policing tasks covering engagement, crime prevention, crime disruption, and safeguarding of vulnerable people. The teams have embedded specialist Missing Persons officers and Children's and Young Person officers, who work with partners in education and social care to protect vulnerable people from harm.

The Local Policing Team responds to calls for assistance from members of the public, undertake proactive overt patrols and focus, however, their main role is reactive policing.

We have a very clear focus on;

**Violence** – disrupting those who commit serious organised crime and to dismantle the supply of controlled drugs in the district. We will target those who carry knives and commit violence ensuring Maldon remains a safe place for all.

**Vulnerability** – we will ensure we engage with our communities to understand their needs and deliver policing to safeguard those who are vulnerable in our community.

**Victims** – we will provide victims with a first-class service.

**Visibility** – we will be visible in our communities to provide reassurance and reduce the fear of crime.

# Maldon Community Policing Team & Town Centre Team:

Welcome to the September's edition of our newsletter. During this month we have been to Southminster and Althorne for Coffee with Cops, we attended the Burnham on Crouch Carnival, our Marine Unit have been patrolling the Maldon Shores and dealt with a driver of a personal watercraft (PWC) who was acting in an antisocial manner and driving the PWC in an unsafe manner. We have also conducted numerous speed checks within the district after we received reports from concerned residents of excessive speed within the district, so the Community Policing Team, Rural Engagement team, Road Crime Team and the Motorcycle Team have all been conducting speed checks in the areas highlighted by local residents. 
The team have been out conducting patrols in Tollesbury this evening making sure everyone is safe. Have a good evening all.




A lot of you may have seen us on patrol in Burnham for the Carnival; massive well done to the organisers!
