297. CHAIRPERSON'S NOTICES

The Chairperson welcomed everyone to the meeting and went through some general housekeeping arrangements for the meeting.

298. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

An apology for absence was received from Councillor S J N Morgan.

299. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

RESOLVED that the Minutes of the meeting of the Committee held on 27 February 2025 be approved and confirmed.

300. DISCLOSURE OF INTEREST

There were none.

301. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

No requests had been received.

302. MALDON DISTRICT COMMUNITY SAFETY PARTNERSHIP UPDATE

The Committee received the report of the Chief Executive reporting the progress of activities undertaken by Maldon Community Safety Partnership (CSP) since the last meeting held on 25 February 2025.

The most recent Essex Police performance summary (to August 2025) was attached as Appendix 1 to the report.

Members noted the continued good work of the CSP and the liaison it had with Essex Police and other statutory partners.

The Community Safety Manager (CSM) took Members through the report and gave a short presentation, advising that the priorities for the year had been agreed and although there were no major changes Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) along with monitoring community tensions had he been added. The Council had received funding from the Police and Fire Commissioner for a number of projects and the work that had recently taken place at Promenade Park, Maldon with pupils from the Plume School was highlighted. Members were advised of a number of other projects within the District, including a successful bid for 'safer streets' funding projects at Riverside Park in Burnham-on-Crouch.

It was noted that the Maldon strategic assessment had been endorsed by One Maldon District and the report set out the process followed along with the priorities and narratives agreed.

Members discussed the report, and further thanks were given to the CSM. In response to a question, the CSM confirmed that he worked closely with the Youth Service and agreed of the importance of involving young people in projects around the District.

In response to a comment made regarding the Council's Local Development Plan, future growth across the District and how the Community Safety Partnership and Police would take this forward, the CSM advised that involvement at an early stage would be beneficial. The Chairperson suggested that the Planning Policy Working Group may wish to consider involving representatives from Community Safety and Police.

The Chairperson referred to the great work being done with schools and young people and how there was a need for future work in Heybridge.

The Chairperson thanked the CSM for his report and presentation.

303. POLICE PERFORMANCE UPDATE

Chief Inspector (CI) Paul Ballard, Chelmsford and Maldon District Commander from Essex Police introduced himself.

CI Ballard drew Members' attention to the Essex Police Performance Summary report, appended to Agenda Item 6 – Maldon District Community Safety Partnership Update. He reminded Members of the current Local Community Policing structure, the policing priorities to reduce crime and highlighted the Force Plan 2024 – 2026. He provided a detailed presentation and highlighted the following areas:

- **Quarter 2 (Q2) Public Perception Survey Results**
- **Maldon Performance Summary** – Over a twelve-month period to August 2025, the Maldon District had seen a reduction in all crimes and had the lowest crime statistics in Essex. Over the same period, dwelling burglaries had dropped along with theft of motor vehicles. Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) incidents had also decreased, and this was largely attributed to the effects of the Maldon Town Team and partner agencies who had worked collaboratively to improve community safety and engagement.
- **Tackling Community issues** – Dedicated Community Safety Engagement officers worked closely with the Tri-Services Officer and the Police in relation to all sorts of public safety areas, fraud awareness, dementia work and fire prevention messages. CI Ballard highlighted some of the work the Maldon Town Team had undertaken in Tolleshunt Knights, Maldon, Burnham-on-Crouch and the surrounding villages.

- **Tackling Speeding** – The local policing team were working hard to address this, and work included daily speed checks across the district. The team had recently worked with the Safer Essex Roads Partnership and Heybridge Primary School to address speeding concerns in the local area. This work had also involved Year 5 pupils from the local school talking to drivers and CI Ballard commented on the impact of this and plans to repeat the initiative with other local schools.

Members were advised of another piece of partnership work with Maldon District Council regarding dangerous and careless driving through Bradwell-on-Sea. Over the last six months proactive patrols and targeted operations had resulted in vehicles being seized and suspects arrested.

- **Community Engagement** – The CI highlighted a number of events that the Police had been involved in and the benefit to the District, including a reduction in reports of anti-social behaviour.
- **Tackling Rural Crime** – The presentation outlined the work of the Rural Engagement Team which included managing unauthorized encampments, hard coursing and poaching, rural community engagement, heritage and wildlife crime, tackling organised agriculture and plant theft and rural road safety.

The Chairperson thanked CI Ballard for his presentation.

Following the update and in response to questions from the Committee, CI Ballard provided the following information:

- **Non-crime hate incidents** – Essex Police was consistently graded as 'outstanding' for its recording and accuracy of crime, and it was noted that recording of such crimes was a requirement that the Government placed on Essex Police. CI Ballard clarified that such incidents wouldn't appear on enhanced Disclosure and Barring checks and how the recording process had been updated in respect of individuals.
- **Road collision** – CI Ballard agreed that road collision in the District was of concern. Essex Police along with other strategic and relevant partners worked alongside each other as part of the Safer Essex Roads Partnership which brought them all together to avoid working in isolation, challenge each other and seek to improve the road safety within Essex. He referred to 'Vision Zero' which was a clear direction set out by the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner alongside the Chief Constable to eliminate deaths and serious injuries on Essex roads by 2040.

The Community Safety Partnership Manager advised that the Council was looking to bid for some funding from the Safer Essex Roads Partnership to use in a campaign regarding road safety in the District. Details of the most appropriate campaign would be discussed with partners.

The CI explained if the Police had concern regarding a speed limit on a particular road, they would raise this with the Highways authority. The Police continued to work closely with Highways regarding roads felt to be unsafe etc. but he was unable to comment on the process that Highways would follow regarding amending the speed limit on a particular road.

- **Maldon front office closure** – CI Ballard advised that Officers had not seen significant impact or received concerning feedback to back following the closure of the front office at Maldon. Members of the Public can use the phone within the Council's reception area which would connect them with a member of the local policing team.

- **Population numbers** – The Essex Police establishment was dictated by funding, including that from Central Government. Numbers are broadly speaking allocated based on a number of factors including the size of population, census data and CI Ballard commented it was a complex mathematical equation. However an increase in population would not automatically equate to an increase in police resources and CI Ballard explained that if there was an increase in crime or a specific incident in an area they would move relevant resources into the District.
- **Shoplifting** – the Maldon District had seen an increase in this area, and CI Ballard explained the work Essex Police had been doing which resulted in a number of prominent repeat shoplifters being prosecuted. He this action would result in a reduction in shoplifting numbers.

In response to a specific incident raised by a Member, CI Ballard advised that the incident had been reviewed and the Police response provided was based on the information provided at the time the incident was reported.

Members asked that their thanks be passed onto Sergeant Matt Dalby and his policing team for the work they did within the District.

304. **VIOLENCE AND VULNERABILITY UPDATE**

The Chairperson introduced Mr James Pearson, Team Manager from the Essex Violence and Vulnerability Unit. Mr Pearson

Mr Pearson gave a brief overview of the work that the Violence and Vulnerability Partnership (VVP) carried out across Essex, specifically highlighting those areas which had an impact in the Maldon District, including:

- How the VVP was attached to the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioners' Office and funded through the Home Office as well as locally raised funding. Its goal, through working with partners, was to reduce and prevent violence in local communities across the whole of Essex. Working with Essex Police and the Community Safety Partnership was one their key goals.
- The work of the VVP impacted across the whole of Essex and the team continued to work to reduce the risk of violence as well as the public perception of the risk of violence, to ensure that all incidents were being reported. Mr Pearson highlighted how they engaged with local communities as well as across the whole of Essex.
- Mr Pearson reported on the success of a knife crime initiative working with young people along with researchers and the youth offending service where the VVP had created an approach and marketing to help empower parents to have impactful conversations to ensure that their children didn't get involved in violence. The VVP were continuing to work with schools and looking to develop a targeted knife crime programme.
- Working closely with the Essex County Fire and Rescue Services Joint Education and Training Team (JETT) to develop their knife crime programme, which involved the JETT team going into every school in Essex to help children understand around all forms of safety, as well as knife crime.
- There had been a high interest from the Maldon area for the community grants offered by the VVP and Mr Pearson outlined these and the involvement of the Community Safety Partnership Manager.

Work with the Council for Voluntary Youth Services across Essex continued and a recently listening report identified how the VVP worked with young people to hear their voices and bring that into the work of the Partnership. Mr Pearson highlighted the latest listening report published and too Members through the areas highlighted within it. It was agreed that Members would be sent a copy of a report produced by Mr Pearson which provided an update on the Essex position including a link to the Maldon Violence and Vulnerability Listening report.

The Chairperson thanked Mr Pearson for his presentation.

In response to questions, Members were advised that the VVP were happy to take suggestions and work with local areas who were working with young people. Mr Pearson spoke about how they were looking at local sports teams and using them as points to anchor communities. It was agreed that Mr Pearsons' contact details would be shared to Members of the Committee. Reference was made to youth clubs and Members were advised that an Essex Youth Map had been produced which identified youth provision across the county and Mr Pearson agreed to leave some information regarding this for Members.

There being no other items of business the Chairperson closed the meeting at 9.02 pm.

MALDON DISTRICT COMMUNITY SAFETY PARTNERSHIP UPDATE

1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

- 1.1 Members are to receive an update on the progress of activities undertaken by the Maldon Community Safety Partnership since the last meeting held on 9 October 2026.

2. RECOMMENDATION

That Members review and comment on the current progress of the initiatives undertaken by the community safety partnership to date.

3. SUMMARY OF KEY ISSUES

3.1 Statutory Duties

- 3.1.1 Officers completed the Maldon strategic assessment, and it was endorsed by One Maldon District Partnership on 13 March 2025. The new strategic assessment will be presented to the Responsible Authorities Group on 5 March 2026. This process involves a crime data review, crime risk matrix scoring and analysis of public perception data. The crime risk matrix scores for Maldon District in 2025 showed the following offences of highest concern: domestic abuse (high and medium risk), death or serious injury caused by unlawful driving, rape, trafficking of drugs and domestic abuse (low risk). Whilst this report relates to the work of the community safety partnership members should acknowledge the wider linked work of the district council for reducing domestic abuse, environmental health, licensing, health improvement and safeguarding. The strategic group agreed the following priorities and narratives which are highlighted on the Maldon District Council (MDC) website:

- Tackling crime and reducing reoffending (with an emphasis on serious violence, gangs, drugs and county lines, and knife crime)
- Driving down anti-social behaviour in public places (with an emphasis on youth nuisance, supporting our residents to solve local issues and improving partnership visibility)
- Identifying and supporting vulnerable people and communities (with an emphasis on domestic abuse, sexual offences, violence against women and girls, monitoring community tensions, mental health, social isolation, suicide prevention, hate crime and a proactive approach to those at risk of exploitation)
- Tackling rural, neighbourhood and environmental crime (focussing on acquisitive crime)

- Promoting road safety and challenging irresponsible driving
- 3.1.2 These reflect priorities already identified in the current Police and Crime Plan (2024-2028), the Essex Crime Prevention Strategy, MDC's Corporate Plan (2025-28), One Maldon District Partnership priorities and the Essex Police Strategic Assessment. The joint strategic needs assessment that is now a requirement under the Serious Violence Duty has been completed by Essex Violence and Vulnerability Unit (VVU) and officers receive monthly data sets on Power Bi from the data scientist to help identify trends and ward hotspots in the district. The agreed interconnected outcomes for the One Maldon District Partnership use the Wider Determinants of Health and Thriving Places approach are:
- Access to Services (including transport)
 - Community and Community Cohesion
 - Community Safety
 - Mental Health
 - Green Spaces
- 3.1.3 The current Essex Police Maldon performance figures for the rolling year to 31 January 2026 (compared to the same period last year) showed a decrease in all crime by **5.2%** (169 less offences) and an increase in anti-social behaviour by **2.2%** (5 more incidents). A summary of the crime profile for Maldon will be presented at the meeting by the police representative. A copy of the Essex Police force performance summary for the county is attached as **APPENDIX 1**. The partnership also receives a monthly data pack for hate crime which is shared with community safety partners and the Independent Advisory Group (IAG). Hate crime data shows a **11.77%** increase in the district compared to the same period last year (6 more offences).
- 3.1.4 Officers continue to work with the Essex Police and partners to ensure that local risks are addressed in relation to the Prevent agenda (preventing violent extremism). The current UK threat remains "SUBSTANTIAL". The Community Safety Manager chairs the Essex Prevent Delivery Group that reports back to the Essex Local Contest Board, Safer Essex and Essex Chief Executives Forum. The partnership receives a regular briefing called the Counter Terrorism Local Profile (CTLP) and regional priorities are extreme right-wing terrorism, self-initiated terrorism, extremism in prison, and the online risk being an enabler. The local benchmarking for Prevent for Essex was completed with the Home Office in February 2025, and Members will note that we (Essex) were exceeding in all areas with one area being duty met: communications and engagement. The next meeting with the Home Office is on 12 March 2026. Home Office funding has enabled Essex to appoint an officer to assist in this area of work and training for the public which is being delivered for older persons and parents on misinformation by Connect Futures. The Prevent Partnership Plan and Situational Risk Assessment have just been refreshed for Quarter 3, and officers are briefing senior management on community tensions and the outcomes from National Learning Reviews.
- 3.1.5 As mentioned earlier in this report, Essex VVU produced a joint strategic needs assessment for serious violence (statutory duty) and the partnership receives regular data. Serious violence is defined as; homicide, manslaughter, violence with injury, personal robbery, rape, and other sexual offences where offences occurred outside the home, were not domestic in nature, a knife, bladed article, firearm, or other weapon was recorded as being used, or the offence was recorded as linked to county lines or gangs. Maldon has a low rate of serious violence (**lowest in Essex**) with **0.12** offences per 1,000 population (7 offences per annum), a reduction of

36.4% from the same period last year (reduction of 4 offences). Copies of the Essex Serious Violence Strategy and Essex Serious Violence Needs Assessment can be found here: [VVU Documentation - Essex Violence and Vulnerability Unit \(essexvvu.co.uk\)](http://essexvvu.co.uk)

3.1.6 A duty that will impact on the work of the partnership will be the Terrorism (Protection of Premises) Act 2024 commonly known as Martyn's Law which received Royal Assent on 3 April 2025. Martyn's Law will impose requirements on premises and events to increase their preparedness for, and protection from, a terrorist attack. The law will require premises to take proportionate steps, depending on the size and nature of the activities that take place. This will be based on qualifying premises and capacity thresholds: standard tier (capacity of 100 or more, enhanced tier 800 or more) and places of worship (standard tier regardless of capacity). Government guidance will be available soon and areas will have two years to comply with the requirements. An Essex Martyn's Law working group has been set up to ensure consistency across Essex in the response to these new requirements. The district council is already planning for compliance when the guidance is released and will be supporting local areas as part of the new measures.

3.2 Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner Update

3.2.1 The partnership continues to support the priorities (listed below) identified in the current Police and Crime Plan (2024 – 2028) which was recently published with the refreshed priorities listed below: [Plans - Essex PFCC](#)

- More local, visible and accessible policing
- Drive down anti-social behaviour and crime
- Beat knife crime and drug gangs and protect young people
- Tackle violence against women and girls and domestic abuse
- Ensure vulnerable people are protected
- Improve road safety and reduce road deaths in Essex to zero

3.2.2 Works continue with several multi-agency groups that support this work locally and across Essex. The Office of the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner (OPFCC) confirmed that core funding for Maldon in 2025 / 26 was **£9,965** and the necessary funding forms were completed and returned as part of the funding agreement. This core funding has been reduced because of the increased contribution for domestic homicide reviews across Essex but there are opportunities to bid for other funds to support the work of the partnership. The annual partnership public meeting hosted by the PFCC was held on 6 November 2025 at West Maldon Community Centre. Topics for discussion included pavement parking, rural crime and road deaths: [Pavement parking, rural crime and road deaths among topics raised at PFCC public meeting for Maldon district - News - Essex PFCC](#) Officers had their annual meeting with the OPFCC on 9 February 2026 to review the performance of the partnership and their office were pleased with progress being made.

3.2.3 Maldon District was awarded funding for three projects from the PFCC Safer Streets funding for 2023 / 24 and 2024 / 25, and officers will be updating Members on progress at this meeting. A key piece of work to ensure that the design of our green spaces and associated facilities are more inclusive has been completed. Officers have worked with the charity Make Space for Girls and consultants, Social Place to produce a report working with a group of Year 9 (now 10) students from the Plume Academy: [A Place for Us, Essex | Social Place](#). This consultation process together with similar work with two Chelmsford schools has been recognised as a winner for

Inspiring Future Generations by the Thornton Education Trust. The new skate provision works at West Maldon Community Centre and Riverside Park, Burnham-on-Crouch are complete, and the new inclusive designs are proving popular for a diverse range of users. The anticipated completion of the skate park at Maldon Promenade is March / April 2026. The graffiti art project and new CCTV is complete at Maldon Promenade. Filming has been completed for the women's safety project, and this project together with a charter for Maldon will be launched in Spring 2026. In addition to this, funding has been secured for a project: Her Place for Burnham-on-Crouch (PFCC Safer Streets and Rural Prosperity Fund) and a similar project funded by Active Essex for a parish council. The Her Place project involved a full day consultation with Make Space for Girls / Social Place at Ormiston Rivers Academy funded by the community safety partnership. The CCTV project for Burnham-on-Crouch will be complete in Spring 2026.

- Safety projects to complement the design of the new Maldon promenade skate park - **£132,252**
- A women's safety project for Maldon District - **£16,000** (plus £8,000 Maldon CSP)
- A CCTV scheme for Burnham-on-Crouch - **£40,874**
- Her Place for Burnham-on-Crouch - **£40,507** (plus £2,500 Maldon CSP)
- Active Essex Project for Parish Council - **£8,500**

3.3 **Community Safety Partnership Hub and Progress Update**

3.3.1 The Community Safety Partnership Hub Tasking for Maldon was launched in August 2024. Meetings are held monthly and has a tasking process which links to the priorities of the Community Safety Partnership (Maldon CSP). This process includes a tasking update from the NPT Sergeant, licensing, a monthly forecast, identified hotspots, patrol plans, communications, complex cases, and organised crime groups. Monthly tasking with Essex Police and the Community Safety Team is also held on Tuesdays and weekly Maldon catch ups. Monthly partnership tasking for Chelmsford and Maldon continues at the Chelmsford CSP Hub. There is an individual action plan for Maldon CSP plus a tasking update which is monitored to ensure that partner actions are completed and performance managed. The Essex Police Maldon Town Team now share the community safety hub with the Community Safety and Community Engagement Teams, with a new interview room for shared use with funding from the community safety partnership. The hub was officially opened by a representative of the Essex OPFCC on 17 February 2025.

3.3.2 Current concerns for the partnership hub focus on violence and vulnerability, modern day slavery, and disruption of organised crime and knife crime (Op Sceptre) together with monitoring "hot spots" such as Maldon High Street, Promenade Park and some of the green spaces across the district. The main area for antisocial behaviour in the summer has been around Hoe Mill Lock and advice offered last year appears to have reduced some of the issues experienced this summer. Partnership operations are proving successful and in recent months there have been significant arrests to disrupt both local and County Line drug networks. The excellent work of the police and partnership is highlighted in Dispatch – Maldon Edition and the new partnership newsletter went live in October 2025 (link below). The team is also delivering sessions at a Falls Prevention Hub in Heybridge (slipper swap event and seated exercise), mental health awareness events, suicide prevention and supporting the Maldon CVS Public Living Room initiative. Operation Henderson was delivered in June 2025 where the partnership will be patrolling taxi ranks and train stations in the district and offering advice to young people and taxi drivers. The team has also been

undertaking lots of community engagement at various locations across the district and utilising the community safety trailer at Promenade Park and recently refurbished Parks Office at Riverside Park, Burnham-on-Crouch.

3.3.3 Current project works for 2025 / 26 include:

- Community engagement events at Promenade Park and Burnham Riverside Park using the corporate trailer (Promenade Park) and refurbished office (Riverside Park)
- The first Safer Maldon Partnership newsletter was published on 28 October 2025: [Welcome to the latest Community Safety newsletter for Maldon](#) with the most recent newsletter being published on 1 February 2026: [Welcome to the latest Safer Maldon Partnership Newsletter](#)
- Funding has been allocated for a Her Space project for Burnham-on-Crouch using Rural Prosperity Fund, community safety funding and PFCC Safer Streets Funding (combined **£40,507** capital funding)

- Falls Prevention Hub at Heybridge (slipper swap event and seated exercise) and Community Mindfulness
- Safe and Well visits with Essex County Fire and Rescue Service and community partners on 9 June (Southminster), 11 June (Tollesbury) and 13 June (Burnham-on-Crouch)
- Make Space for Girls consultation at the Plume Academy was delivered over a three-day period in July 2024 and the school was involved in the graffiti art project in July 2025: [Latest news | Maldon District Council](#)
- Nights of Action were delivered at Maldon High Street in February 2025 and May 2025, and anti-spiking events at licensed venues in September 2025
- Water safety visits in Burnham-on-Crouch, Bradwell, Maldon and Heybridge Basin with ECFRS
- Trucam is currently being delivered across 18 parishes at 45 different locations – from 1 April 2025 – 30 November 2025 there have been 2870 captures

4. CONCLUSION

- 4.1 That Members note the priorities for 2025 / 26 and progress on the community safety partnership. The shared working arrangements between Maldon and Chelmsford continue to support local priorities, high level policing priorities and the priorities of the revised PFCC plan and has been strengthened with the co-location of the community policing team and additional policing resources in town centres and rural areas. The increased footprint for the neighbourhood policing team at MDC offices will strengthen this partnership further. Maldon CSP remains efficient and responsive to emerging issues and more importantly positions itself strongly for future funding arrangements with the Essex Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner, statutory partners, and local / national initiatives.
