Introduction

The purpose of 'Your Local Police Update' is to keep our community across Maldon informed and up to date on policing activity. The ambition is to publish an update every month to provide an overview in the following areas:

- Community Policing Team
- Town Centre Team
- Local Policing Team

- Forthcoming Engagement

The Community Policing Team encompasses the Town Centre Team. They undertake proactive and reactive policing tasks covering engagement, crime prevention, crime disruption, and safeguarding of vulnerable people. The teams have embedded specialist Missing Persons officers and Children's and Young Person officers, who work with partners in education and social care to protect vulnerable people from harm.

The Local Policing Team responds to calls for assistance from members of the public, undertake proactive overt patrols and focus, however, their main role is reactive policing.

We have a very clear focus on;

Violence – disrupting those who commit serious organised crime and to dismantle the supply of controlled drugs in the district. We will target those who carry knives and commit violence ensuring Maldon remains a safe place for all.

Vulnerability – we will ensure we engage with our communities to understand their needs and deliver policing to safeguard those who are vulnerable in our community.

Victims – we will provide victims with a first-class service.

Visibility – we will be visible in our communities to provide reassurance and reduce the fear of crime.

Team:

Welcome to the September's edition of our newsletter. During this month we have been to Southminster and Althorne for Coffee with Cops, we attended the Burnham on Crouch Carnival, our Marine Unit have been patrolling the Maldon Shores and dealt with a driver of a personal watercraft (PWC) who was acting in an antisocial manner and driving the PWC in an unsafe manner. We have also conducted numerous speed checks within the district after we received reports from concerned residents of excessive speed within the district, so the Community Policing Team, Rural Engagement team, Road Crime Team and the Motorcycle Team have all been conducting speed checks in the areas highlighted by local residents. Our Motor Cycle unit patrolled South Woodham Ferrers after we received reports of speeding, which saw 8 drivers being stopped for speeding and one driver being arrested. The Community Policing Team have also been to Tollesbury, Althorne, Maldon and Southminster for speed checks this month, this has also resulted in numerous drivers receiving tickets, fines and court dates!

We have recently received reports of speeding and antisocial behaviour in #SouthWoodhamFerrers so our Motor Cycle Unit patrolled the area and conducted speed checks on the 7th of September 2021.

8 drivers were caught speeding and one failed to stop for the Officers but they were soon located and found to have no insurance, no licence, was driving whilst under the influence of drugs and they were in possession of drugs.

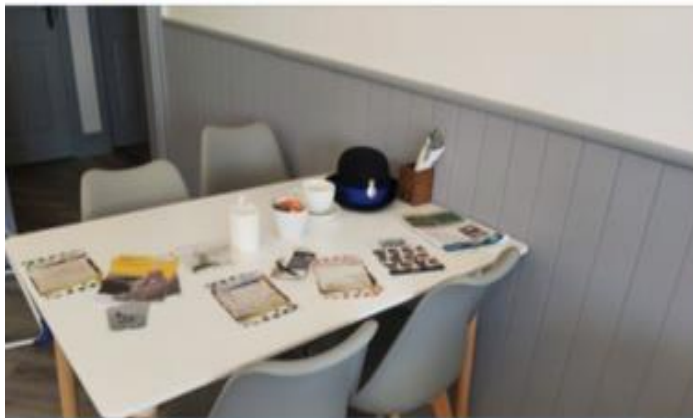
