Noted – the Flood Warning and Evacuation Plan submitted is basic and, therefore, it is recommended that an additional condition is imposed requiring the submission of a Flood Warning and Evacuation Plan is imposed if planning permission is granted.

#### 8. PROPOSED ADDITIONAL CONDITION

22. Notwithstanding the details submitted, the dwellings hereby permitted shall not be occupied unless and until a Flood Warning and Evacuation Plan has been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. The occupiers of each of the dwellings shall be provided with a copy of the approved Plan prior to their first occupation of the dwellings.

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<u>REASON</u> In order to minimise the potential adverse impacts of flooding, in accordance with Policies S4 and D5 of the approved Maldon District Local Development Plan and the NPPF.

### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATIVE**

13. The applicant may need an environmental permit for flood risk activities if they want to do work in, under, over or within 8m from a fluvial main river and from any defence structure or culvert or 16m from a tidal main river and from any flood defence structure or culvert. The Limebrook South Arm is designated a 'main river'.
