The Council is currently not sure on the liklihood of a need increase, despite the planning definition change, which is why it has commissioned an update to the independant Maldon District Gypsy & Traveller and Travelling Showpeople Accommodation Needs Assessment. The Council notes Para 13 of national planning policy for Traveller Sites which expresses that traveller sites should be sustainable in economic, social and environmental terms meaning policies should a) promote peaceful and integrated co-existence between the site and the local community as the Parish Council notes; but also b) promote access to health, c) ensure children can attend school regularly, d) provide a settled base that reduces need for long-distance travelling and possible environmental damage caused by unauthorised encampments, e) provide proper consideration of the effect of local environmental quality on the health and well-being of any travellers that wish to locate there, f) avoid placing undue pressure on local infrastructure and services, g) are not located in areas of flood risk and h) reflect the extent to which traditional lifestyles can contribute to sustainability.

The Council recognises that some Gypsy, Traveller and Travelling Showpeople households, who continue to travel for work or cultural purposes, may prefer being closer to larger roads, as well as community services such as education and healthcare. It is also recognised that Gypsy, Traveller and Travelling Showpeople households do often include extended families living close by/ or the same site as each other. The Maldon District Gypsy, Traveller and Travelling Showpeople Accommodation Assessment (GTAA) has posed questions through the household interviews to establish household make-up, household needs for travelling, as well as household needs for a non-nomadic lifestyle.

Most comments have been made advising the Council to be mindful that new sites need to offer a good quality of life, be close to education/health care services, be connected to utilities and offer ease of access for larger vehicles. In a similar fashion there has been a suggestion that the sustainability of new sites are considered, together with how they can integrate renewable energy solutions.
