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### Introduction

Maldon District Council (the Council) declared a Climate Emergency in February 2021 and in January 2022 the Council's Climate Action Strategy (CAS) was adopted. The CAS is a positive step to identifying ways to reduce carbon emissions and increase climate resilience across the Maldon District. This will include developing strong climate partnership links, pushing to be the first in line for sustainable transport options, finding ways to support sustainable agriculture, encouraging development that meets all future homes standards, and engaging and empowering our communities to make low carbon and informed choices.




Figure 1 The Carbon Management Hierarchy

When the CAS was adopted, the Council committed to developing a yearly Climate Action Plan (CAP), which would set the actions and initiatives that would help us on our net zero journey. The CAP aims to prioritise actions in accordance with the Carbon Management Hierarchy (Figure 1), where the most desired actions are those that avoid emissions, followed by those that reduce or replace emissions. Offsetting should only be used as a last resort after all other options have been exhausted.

The actions and initiatives within the CAP have been categorised into short-, medium and long-term objectives, where:

- Short-term refers to actions that will be completed in 2023/2024
- Medium-term refers to actions that will begin in 2023/2024 but are not due for completion until 2025/2026. In this case updates will be published in yearly action plans up to 2025/2026
- Long-term are actions that will be begin in 2023/2024 but may be ongoing and will be updated in each yearly action plan

This plan sets out the activities that the Council can lead on and undertake in 2023/2024. The CAP will be delivered within existing resources, although external funding opportunities will also be sought.

It should be noted that this action plan will evolve in response to emerging local, regional, and national policy and legislation.

#### The Carbon Management Hierarchy

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## Who has contributed to the Action plan?

The CAS cannot be implemented by the Council alone, and the actions set out are ones which the Council can take, either alone, or in partnership with others. In addition to the steer from national government strategies, and a growing evidence base on the impact that local authorities can have on climate change, the action plan has been developed in collaboration with Council officers across the authority. This approach has helped identified how the Council might act to deliver the CAS 'pledges' and what the actions should be

### Climate Action Plan 2023/2024

The remainder of this document is based on the 'areas of focus' as set out in the CAS as Climate Action Pledges. These are detailed on pages 5-8 of the CAS and summarised in Figure 2.

The five Climate Action Pledges are championed by eight Council employees, and they are known as the 'Pledge Connectors.' The Pledge Connectors are strategically placed across the Council and their role is to provide specialist support and guidance on the prioritisation and progress of the pledge actions.

The CAP details the priority actions within each pledge for 2023/2024. They have been prioritised according to their impact on carbon emissions and their ability to kick start the necessary change, or generate the understanding, that we will need to help us move to a carbon neutral Maldon District by 2030.

This CAP includes specific projects and activities that have emerged from the pledges within the CAS since its adoption in 2021.

## Climate action co-benefits

The CAP has the potential to deliver many other local benefits, including improved health and wellbeing, increased community cohesion, economic opportunities and increased resilience to extreme weather events and rising fuel prices.

Co-benefits are important because they demonstrate a connection between climate action and other issues. For example, reducing air pollution from emissions of fossil fuels reduces environmental impacts and improves health and wellbeing. Here, health and wellbeing is the co-benefit. This action plan recognises the co-benefit(s) of each action.

Example of co-benefits of tackling climate change are presented in figure 3, which also includes the symbols used to represent them in the pledge descriptions.



#### Health and wellbeing

E.g. more efficient homes, access to affordable warmth, cleaner air, increased levels of activity through walking and cycling, reducing climate anxiety and improved quality of life for residents.



#### **Economy**

E.g. better offices, creation of new jobs, enhanced green skills and training, Local green goods and services, local investment opportunities. reduced energy costs, reduced environmental impacts and a more inclusive economy.



#### Resilience

E.g. ability to withstand impacts of climate changes, ability to cope with future increases in energy prices, increase adaptability to future changes such as transition to electric vehicles (EVs).



#### **Community cohesion**

E.g. alleviation of fuel poverty, clean air, improved access to green spaces and community engagement

## **Engagement with Maldon District** communities

In addition to the five Climate Action Pledges, the Council will continue to explore effective ways of engaging with partners and stakeholders and will look for ways to encourage and support delivery of the CAS through local initiatives. This section of the CAP sets out the community engagement actions that will take place during the period 2023/2024. As set out in the CAS, the Council with adopt an Asset-Based Community Development<sup>1</sup> approach to working with organisations, residents, businesses, and the entire community of Maldon District. Many of the actions will need to be delivered in partnership with these stakeholders in a delivery or an advisory capacity.

The Council Climate Action Friends (CAF) group has been set up to enable the community to sign up and receive climate action updates and share their ideas with other CAF Members, as of Feb 2023 there were 35 members. The Council will facilitate up to four CAF member meetings a year, which will act as a sounding board to help shape communications and initiatives to implement the objectives of the CAS. An inaugural meeting is planned for April 2023

The Council will explore effective ways of engaging with partners and stakeholders, and look for ways to encourage and support delivery of the CAS through the following local activities:
